EIDFJORD CRUISE PORT - HARDANGERFJORD

Eidfjord is located in the innermost part of the famous Hardangerfjord. The cruise port is located in the centre of Eidfjord and offers the very best and safest conditions.

Eidfjord has a population of around 950. We are a thriving community and enjoy the fjord and mountains throughout the year. Hardangerfjord is the second longest fjord in Norway, 179 km – also called the Queen of the Fjords.

Vøringsfossen waterfall has been Norway's most visited natural attraction for a long time.

The construction of the viewpoints and the parking area at Fossatromma was completed in September 2024, making this attraction one of Norway's three national tourist icons! The project had been ongoing for several years, and now the new viewpoints by Fossli Hotel and the spectacular step bridge crossing above the waterfall are fully open to visitors. The Hardangervidda plateau and the Hardangerfjord continue to draw visitors from far beyond Norway's borders.

Due to the mild climate the region is also the orchard of Fjord Norway – here we grow apples, plums, pears and cherries. The blossom season in May/June is unique – the mountain sides are covered in white, pink and red flowers, from the white snow at the top down to the blue fjord. July – October is the harvesting season for fruit, sweet cherry and cider festivals in the small villages along the fjord.

Eidfjord offers a unique natural environment. With large contrasts and small distances you can experience the most and best of what Norway has to offer. Our visitors can find peace and quiet in the natural environment, in addition to visiting many of our attractions or joining many of our adventures and activities. Eidfjord is the gateway to the Hardangervidda, the largest high mountain plateau in Europe and Norway's largest national park.

Welcome to annual events and festivals in Eidfjord: National Day (May 17th), Local Food Festival (spring and autumn), Midsummer Night (June 23rd), Hardangerjøkulen Ultra - 100K (July), Norseman Xtreme Triathlon (August), Hardangervidda Marathon (Aug/Sept) and Hardanger Music Festival (Autumn).



The HARDANGER BRIDGE, which opened in August 2013, has made Eidfjord easier to access. It is a 2 lane suspension bridge with sidewalks for pedestrians and bikers. The main span is 1310 meters and the total length is 1380 m. The airdraft is 55 meters. The bridge is the longest suspension bridge in Norway.







THE YELLOW ROUTE on the map takes you to the graves from the Iron- and Viking ages (7) on the Hæreid mountain plateau appr. 100 metres above sea level. This is the largest prehistoric burial ground in Western Norway. During your roundtrip you'll get to a very nice viewpoint of the fjord from Hodna (8). Starting point: By the bridge. Duration: 75-90 minutes.

THE DARK BLUE ROUTE on this map takes you to the churches (4 + 5) in Eidfjord, the new church from 1980 and the old, mideaval St. Jacobs church built in 1309 (closed). Visit Tråagarden Farm (3). Experience local farm traditions and livestock. Farm shop with local cider and apple juice from Draopar. Visit Ravenheart Viking Exhibit (9) on your way back. These are both open on most days with cruise ships. Duration: appr. 60 min.

THE LIGHT BLUE ROUTE continue your trek from the yellow route. The route goes from Hereidsvegen on to a rough path with great fjord views, thereafter steep down to a residential area and further on along the fjord back to the center. This route is a bit more difficult than the other routes. Duration: appr. 60 min.

Guidelines for CRUISE GUESTS

Visiting Cruise Norway's Ports & Destinations

Welcome to Norway! We're delighted to have you visiting our beautiful ports and destinations.

To help make your stay safe, enjoyable, and respectful of local customs, we kindly ask you to keep the following guidelines in mind:

KEY RECOMMENDATIONS FOR CRUISE LINES

- **Engage with Local Destination Management**
Coordinate with local destination partners to ensure accurate and relevant information in tour descriptions and port presentations.
- **Use Certified Local Guides and Services**
Used certified local guides when available. Prioritise use of local equipment (e.g., RIB boats, scooters, bicycles), or include added local value such as entrance to local attractions or locally sourced refreshments.
- **Respect the Port and Local Communities**
Avoid the use of outdoor loudspeakers, ship whistles, or music during both arrival and departure – especially in residential areas and sensitive cultural sites.
- **Follow Local Guidelines for nature Access and safety**
Ensure nature trails or protected areas used in tours are approved by local authorities and used in accordance with local regulations.
- **Avoid the use of Excursion Stickers**
Stickers often end up as litter. Use alternative methods for guest identification and grouping.
- **Consider Longer Port Stays**
Longer stays typically result in higher guest satisfaction and increased value creation for local businesses.

- **Contact the local Tourist Office**
The best way of fully discover each destination is to contact the local tourist office or destination management for advice.

- **Buy local**
We encourage you to shop locally made products and Norwegian design.
- **Keep Norway clean**
Please help us keep Norway clean. Use rubbish bins where available or carry your litter with you until it can be recycled. Please do not throw cigarette butts on the ground.
- **Flying drone?**
If you want to use a drone, you need to follow national rules:

- **Learn a few Norwegian words**
Learn a few words in Norwegian. It helps create meaningful connections with locals.
- **Ask before taking photos of people**
Feel free to chat with people but always ask before photos. Respect people's privacy and never photograph children at kindergartens or schools.
- **Do not feed birds**
Please do not feed birds. It harms nature and creates problems in cities.

LOCAL GUIDELINES FOR CRUISE LINES

ETA

- We prefer ETA after 9 am and no use of outdoor PM/radio before 9 am. In general we appreciate limited use of outdoor PM while docking in Eidfjord and no use of outdoor PM or horn after 7 pm.

Drills

- Not before 10 am or after 6 pm. Not on Sundays and public holidays.

Ship's whistle

- For normal manoeuvring or emergencies. Farewell signal before 7 pm or in agreement with PFSO.

Music when berthed

- Low volume only. Not allowed on Sundays and public holidays.

Sail away music

- Not allowed on open decks.

Public outside announcement

- Avoid public announcement outside, except in case of emergencies.

Lifeboat / rescue boat

- To be agreed in advance.

Tender boat

- To be agreed in advance.

Ships own rib/kayak tours

- Activities must comply with Norwegian laws. Speed restriction acc. to regulations in municipality of Eidfjord. Limit 5 knts in inner harbour. We strongly recommend to use local companies offering these activities.

Organised bike tours

- Activities must comply with Norwegian laws. Groups of maximum 10 bikers due to safety along the road. We strongly recommend using a local guide and/or local companies offering these activities.

Washing and painting

- Environmentally friendly chemicals only. Not on Sundays or public holidays.

Grinder / rust picker

- Not permitted.

Scrubbers

- Open loop not permitted. Eidfjord cruise port follows the national guidelines.

Spray painting

- Not permitted.

Maintenance

- To be agreed in advance.

Diving / hull rinsing and inspection

- To be agreed in advance.

Hull and underwater cleaning

- To be agreed in advance.

Propeller polishing

- To be agreed in advance.

Number of ships in port

- The infrastructure capacity ashore limits the number of ships per day. We want to avoid anchoring.

Number of passengers

- The infrastructure capacity ashore limits the number of passengers in port per day.

Enjoy your stay in Eidfjord!

- Pay attention and please sail slowly through the Hardangerfjord.

LOCAL GUIDELINES FOR CRUISE GUESTS

- Please do not destroy installations and property by attaching stickers.
- Please do not wander off the trails when walking or hiking, due to safety reasons.
- Please refrain from entering or taking photos of children in school or kindergarten play areas, public beaches and properties.

RATES FOR CRUISESHIPS AT EIDFJORD CRUISE PORT 2026

ALL RATES ARE EXCL. VAT AND VALID FOR UP TO A 24-HOUR PERIODE.

As of 01.01.2022 we've introduced environmentally differentiated fees based on EPI - Environmental Port Index on all rates except for water supply. The deadline for reporting is 72 hours.

There might be some additional costs if we're required to comply to the shipping company's health protocols. This may consist of additional staff at the port or other unforeseen costs.

THE ENVIRONMENTAL PORT INDEX

The Environmental Port Index is founded upon a sophisticated calculation for the environmental impact of ships, which has been developed in collaboration with DNV and numerous shipping industry experts.

A unique reporting tool was then built around the calculation, with the aim of empowering ship owners and port operators to increase their operational efficiency while reducing their impact on the environment.

EPI Benefits: Cleaner water, fresher air, and a greener footprint for our industry; the Environmental Port Index has the potential to enhance the quality of life of everyone around the world. And in addition to locally and globally felt environmental benefits, the EPI opens up opportunities to deliver direct economic and ethical benefits, for ship owners and port operators alike.

Cruise ships shall report data from their call at port to epi@dnv.com no later than 72 hours after departure. This data will be used to allocate an EPI score, ranging from 0 (worst) to 100 (best). A change in % will be calculated using the following formula, and will apply on all rates except for water supply.

The following EPI will apply for 2025:



Ulvik offers an active holiday with a number of outdoor activities. Farm visits and excursions by coach and fjord cruisers are also included in our shore-ex menu. Ulvik and Hardanger, being the orchard of Norway, are famous for the fruit blossom in May. From June until late October we harvest sweet cherries, plums, pears and apples. Take a stroll through the compact village centre where you will find public services, shops, hotels and cafes as well as different exhibitions of arts and crafts. Shopping of high quality local products can be done at the Tourist Office and at local shops.
